Guest Pastor: Next Sunday, November 2nd, retired Pastor Jene Jahnke will be conducting worship and Bible study.



Jeremiah 31:31-34

They broke that covenant of mine, although I was a husband to them, declares the LORD. <sup>33</sup>But

this is the covenant I will make with the house of Israel after those days, declares the LORD. I will put my law in their minds, and I will write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people. <sup>34</sup>No longer will each one teach his neighbor, or each one teach his brother, saying, "Know the LORD," because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the LORD, for I will forgive their guilt, and I will remember their sins no more.

#### SECOND READING


Galatians 5:1-6

<sup>1</sup>It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not allow anyone to put the yoke of slavery on you again. <sup>2</sup>Look, I, Paul, tell you that if you allow yourselves to be circumcised, Christ will be of no benefit to you. <sup>3</sup>I testify again to every man who allows himself to be circumcised that he is obligated to do the whole law. <sup>4</sup>You who are trying to be declared righteous by the law are completely separated from Christ. You have fallen from grace.

<sup>5</sup>Indeed, through the Spirit, we by faith are eagerly waiting for the sure hope of righteousness. <sup>6</sup>For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision matters. Rather, it is faith working through love that matters.

GOSPEL John 8:31–36





#### PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

- P: Almighty and eternal God, when the set time had come, you sent your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, to take our place under the demands of the law and endure the just punishment for our sins. You raised him from death in glorious splendor and for his sake, you richly and daily forgive sins.
- C: Praise the Lord, my soul, and forget not all his benefits.
- P: When the set time had come, you poured out your Spirit on your people and called them to proclaim the gospel to every creature. Equipped and encouraged, they carried the story of salvation to all the world.
- C: The Lord reigns, let the earth be glad; let the distant shores rejoice.
- P: When the set time had come, you raised up your servant Martin Luther to destroy the idols of the medieval age and to restore the pure teaching of the Scriptures. You granted power and success to the proclamation of the gospel, and your holy Church grew and prospered throughout the world.
- C: God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble.
- P: When the set time had come, you made our fathers bold to take their stand on the truth of your Word. Guided by your Spirit, they joined hands and hearts under a shared confession and with a determined resolve to work together in the ministry. You have blessed their sons and daughters and enabled us to preserve and proclaim the saving gospel of your Son.
- C: Sing to the Lord, for he has done glorious things; let this be known to all the world.
- P: Let this be the time when you renew us again by Word and Sacrament, when you reform our hearts and minds, and when you restore to us the joy of fellowship and service. Grant to us in this age and in this place the courage of the apostles, the steadfastness of the reformers, and the dedication of the fathers of our church's past.
- C: May the Lord our God be with us as he was with our fathers; may he never leave us or forsake us.
- P: Let this be a time to imitate the kind-hearted souls in our church who served the sick, helped the disabled, cared for the abandoned, and comforted the dying. Provide occasions to serve them and times to pray for them. Keep all your children in your powerful and gracious care.
- C: As we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers.
- P: Let this be a time when we recommit ourselves to the ministry of the gospel of your Son. Let us find joy in our unity, zeal for our work, and, if it is your will, success in our labor. And give us faith to take up again the trumpet none can silence or mistake and grant us courage to proclaim once more for all the world to hear: The feast is ready! Come to the feast!
- C: May God be gracious to us and bless us and make his face shine upon us, that your ways may be known on earth, your salvation among all nations.
- P: Hear us, Lord, as we pray in silence.

#### Silent prayer.

- P: Let this time and all our times be used to give thanks for your grace in Christ and to praise you for calling us into your mission to save.
- C: Satisfy us in the morning with your unfailing love and establish the work of our hands. Amen.

## LORD'S PRAYER


