## ■ READINGS FROM GOD'S WORD ■

First Reading Jeremiah 26:8–15

<sup>8</sup>When Jeremiah had finished saying everything the LORD had commanded him to say to all the people, then the priests, the prophets, and all the people seized him and said, "You must die! "Why do you prophesy in the name of the LORD that this house will be like Shiloh and that this city will be desolate with no one living here?" All the people crowded around Jeremiah in the House of the LORD.

 $^{10}$ When the officials of Judah heard about these things, they came up from the king's house to the House of the Lord and sat in the entrance of the New Gate of the Lord's house.

<sup>11</sup>Then the priests and the prophets said to the officials and to all the people, "This man deserves the sentence of death because he has been prophesying against this city, as you heard with your own ears."

<sup>12</sup>Then Jeremiah said to all the officials and to all the people, "The Lord sent me to prophesy against this house and against this city all the things that you have heard. <sup>13</sup>Now reform your ways and your actions, and obey the Lord your God. Do with me whatever seems good and right in your eyes. <sup>15</sup>But you can be certain of this. If you put me to death, you will bring innocent blood on yourselves and on this city and on those who live here, for it is true that the Lord has sent me to you to speak all these words in your hearing."

# Second Reading


**Philippians 3:17—4:1**

GOSPEL Luke 13:31–35



#### **CONFESSION OF CHRISTIAN FAITH**

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. 


## WORDS OF INSTITUTION
