CHRISTMAS LITANY

- P: Come, let us sing for joy to the Lord, let us shout aloud to the Rock of our salvation.
- C: O Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth. You have set your glory above the heavens.
- P: Give thanks to the Lord of lords, to him who alone does great wonders, who by his understanding made the heavens, who spread out the earth upon the waters, who made the great lights—the sun, to govern the day, the moon and stars to govern the night.
- C: Great is the Lord and mighty in power; his understanding has no limit.
- P: But our iniquities have separated us from our God; our sins have hidden his face from us. We look for light, but all is darkness; for brightness, but we walk in deep shadows. We look for deliverance, but it is far away.
- C: For our offenses are many in his sight, and our sins testify against us. Our offenses are ever with us, and we acknowledge our sins.

SECOND READING

Colossians 1:15-23


What does this mean?

THE MESSAGE

A SAVIOR IS BORN "Let All Together Praise Our God"

John 1:1-14

- In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was with God in the beginning. ³ Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. ⁴ In him was life, and that life was the light of men. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it.
- ⁶ There came a man who was sent from God; his name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all men might believe. ⁸ He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light. ⁹ The true light that gives light to every man was coming into the world.
- ¹⁰ He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. ¹¹ He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. ¹² Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God— ¹³ children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.
- ¹⁴ The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION
